This could have been a sign for future troubles but other than this minor inconvenience everything else went like clockwork arriving back in Knowle safely and on time.

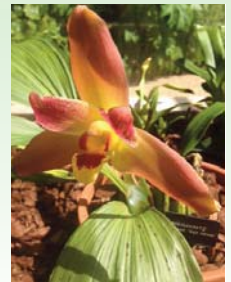

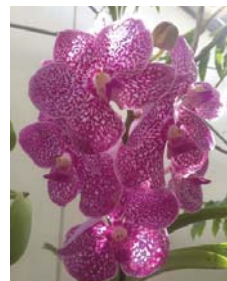
The greenhouse is extensive with a large amount of automation installed at incredible expense but without it the workload for staff would have been prohibitive. We all marvelled at the size of the specimen plants

many hanging up in massive hanging baskets most of which were so huge that none of us would have been able to accommodate them in our own collections.

Most genera were represented in 2 greenhouse areas – one cool the other intermediate/warm. Both housed numerous species but were dominated by a large number of showy hybrids which David explained were key to him being able to provide large colourful exhibits for the public areas which is what paying customers expect.



We noted a large number of Thunias growing in the intermediate house and were very pleased to accept the gift of a Thunia gattonensis from David which sat between my feet for the journey back to the Midlands. However, I didn't realise at the time that I might have



trouble getting this plant out of the Wisley Garden - sure enough I was challenged at the main gate. Fortunately, David had called ahead to warn them that I would be carrying a plant and fortunately the lady in charge saved me from interrogation and I was waved through.

For those that came to the AGM this Thunia was offered at the Auction with all the proceeds donated to the society – many thanks to David.

Besides the orchid collection there is so much to see at Wisley that a day hardly does it justice but by mid afternoon most of us were flagging in the heat so setting off home in an air conditioned coach was most welcome.

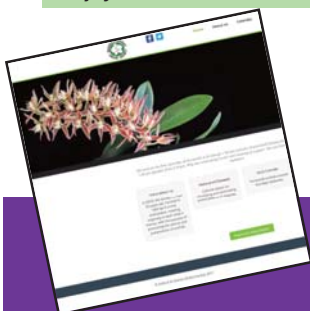
Anyway it was great that so many members were able to join the trip along with our friends from Central, Hinckley and Birmingham & Midland Orchid Societies.
