As you know, the current committee are very helpful and would give you all the help you may need.

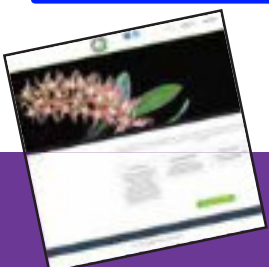
Devastating fire for Keith

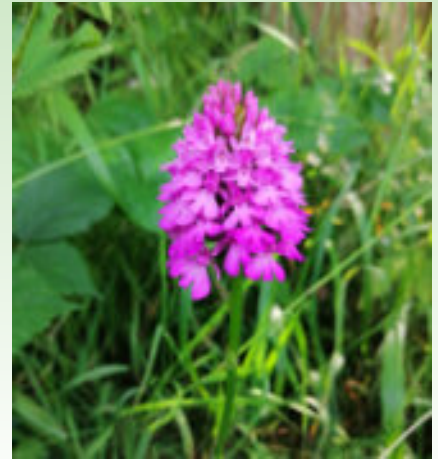

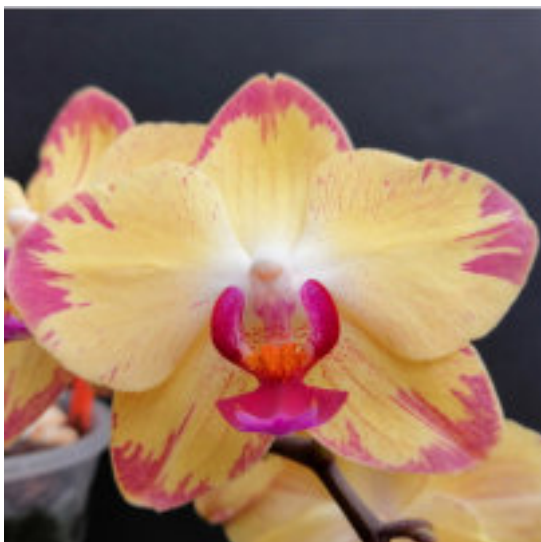

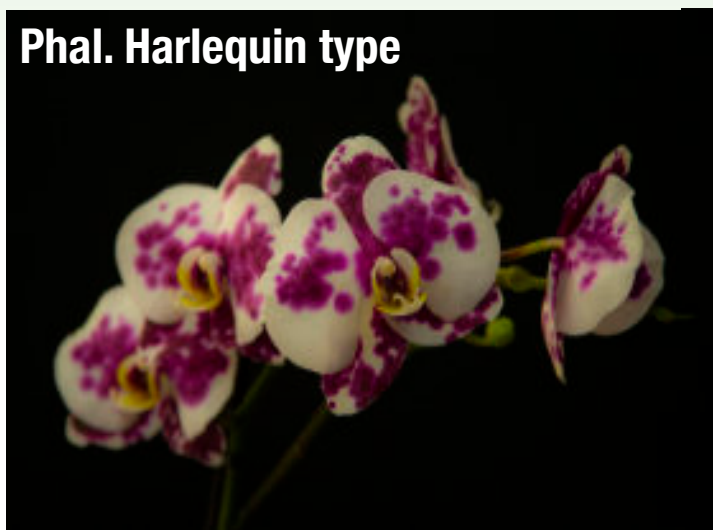

With some interesting finds - by Janet and Martin

At Ettington Cutting absolutely masses of Pyramids Orchids, but only a handful of Bee Orchids, Butterfly Conservation manage the site, so there are lots of other wild flowers too, though with no sun when we were there we didn't see many Butterflies, there's hardly any Ragwort so only a few Cinnabar Moths, on the way back we saw a huge Bracket Fungi.

On a visit on my own to Moathouse Reserve I found Common Spotted and Heath Spotted Orchids growing within yards of each other, a place to look for hybrids in the future.

A quick pop into Hillfield Park and a surprise meeting with Margaret Dale, who showed me where the pale pink Pyramid Orchids were.

At Cuttlebrook Martin and I found more Common Spotted, there was a single Pyramid there last year, but no sign of it and the area appeared to have been cut.

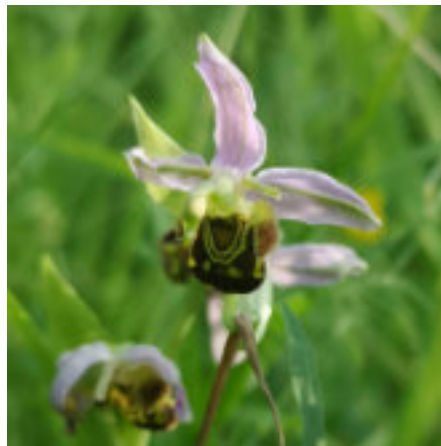
This was followed by a visit to Windmill Hill where just one Bee Orchid had escaped the mowing of the grass verge, lots of Pyramid Orchids on the hill, more wild flowers and Butterflies, so lively in the heat it was hard to get photo's.

And on our latest outing we nearly missed seeing Warwickshires Dune Helleborines, after seeing them in growth, the hot weather meant they had developed very quickly and most were going over when we went back.

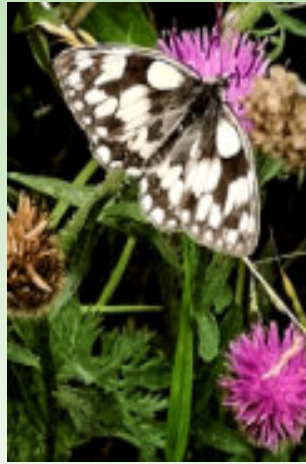

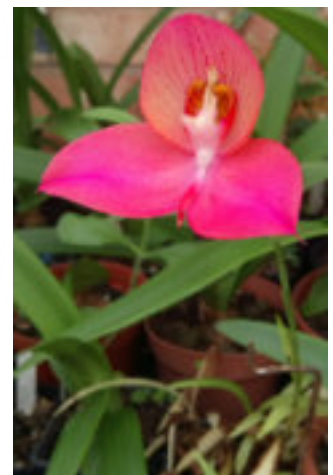
