I am pleased to say that 23 members turned up for the AGM with everything that was on the agenda being carried unanimously.

The meeting kicked off with the Chairman's and Treasurer's Reports which both concluded that we had had a good year with physical meetings taking place again and including a very successful Spring Show at our new venue.

The big issues in front of us are the reduction in Membership with the corresponding reduction in subscriptions leaving a hole in the finances and the resignation of 4 members of the committee.

All those committee members standing down have given the Society great service over many years, so a vote of thanks was given that was warmly supported.

Malcolm agreed to stay on for the year ahead as chairman despite only taking it on in April to avoid the society folding.

However, the sticking point was likely to be the Treasurer's role, where we had not received any nominations. I am pleased to report that George Mayes agreed to take over as treasurer, meaning that our two officers are now in place.

Additionally, Lina and David agreed to

continue on the committee and Grace Mayes and Liz Kirk also volunteered to serve meaning that we now have a working committee for the next 12 months.

The financial shortfall reported for last year will be repeated if no action is taken.

Therefore, it was proposed that we reduce the number of meetings per year to 8 and increase the subscriptions $\pounds15$ /Single and $\pounds20$ /Joint Membership.

Both proposals were carried unanimously meaning that our subscriptions almost balance with the cost of the hiring the Hall.

The year ahead now looks bright and over the next couple of months the committee will meet to lay out our plans for the next year.

Our Spring Show at Bentley Heath Community Hall has already been booked for Saturday 25th March and we anticipate the special concessionary tickets for Malvern to continue.

Add that to a full year's programme of speakers and the year ahead looks bright.

The afternoon concluded with our Auction where many members went home with some very nice plants.
